Just a reminder...The last day that we can accept original May 2016 claims or upward revisions is August 24, 2016.

Claims Corner

Please let us know when school is out every month.

Internet Claimers: click on the school out column or use the child's calendar to indicate he/she is out of school for the summer. This is a great tool to use for the whole year for each child's schedule. Go to children then manage child calendar.

Scan & Manual Claimers: please write a note on your Claim Information Form or on the claim itself every month about all school closures. If deductions have been made on claims we must have a school calendar to verify the school closure.

If you did child care on the Fourth of July you must document that on your claim.

If you are planning to move you need to notify us right away. The license on your old home will not be valid in your new home. We need to mail you the move packet so you can be prepared. You also need to notify your licensing specialist so that arrangements can be made for new license application and home inspection. Tiering changes when you move.

We must have school information for children who are in school (even if they are only in care during school breaks).
