Dental Health Month

The February 2020 National Children's Dental Health Month is brought to you by the American Dental Association. This month-long national health observance brings together thousands of dedicated professionals, healthcare providers, and educators to promote the benefits of good oral health to children, their caregivers, teachers and many others.

Fluoride was added to municipal water supplies 75 years ago as a means to improve children's dental health. With bottled water being so prevalent and inexpensive, it is important to remind parents that tap water is best for children to support healthy teeth and reduce dental cavities. Bottled water does not have fluoride added.

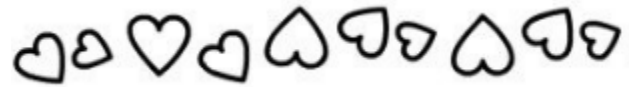
How to see CACFP Payments for Income Tax Reporting

3. Choose Claim Statements from the list
4. Click on Tax Report to see your yearly details

## CORNER

We want you to receive the most money you can each month. Claims Corner has useful reminders and hints to help you do just that.

- When school-age children are in care on a usual school day due to being sick or no school, please mark them “Out of School” in KidKare or add a note on your claim.
- Milk reminder: Children 1-2 years old are served Unflavored Whole milk on the CACFP. All children over 2-5 years are served Unflavored 1% Fat Free milk.
- Wyoming providers: claim payments will be issued by the 20<sup>th</sup> of each month. If the payment will be later than the 20<sup>th</sup>, we will notify providers by email. Wildwood has no control over the payment date, which is determined by the WDE office.

**\*The last day we can receive original December claims for processing is February 21, 2019.**

**\*The last day we can receive original January claims for processing is March 24, 2019.**
