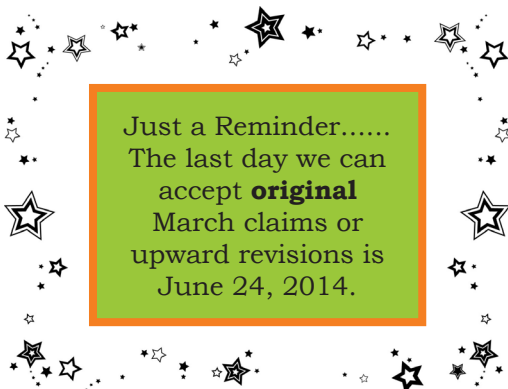
## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

## CLAIMS CORNER

If your license was due for renewal in May, Wildwood must have a copy of the license with the 2015 sticker attached before we can request funds to pay your claim. Please mail, email or fax a copy to the office. Watch for your continuation notice to arrive in the mail and act on it as soon as possible.

Provider's that use the internet to record their menus/attendance and you lose internet service or your computer crashes you must call the office the day of or the day after you discover the problem so that we can give you guidance on what to do in regards to your menus/attendance.



Pizza must be either homemade or have the CN label in order to be creditable on the food program. If you find a pizza that has a CN label the pizza can count for meat, crust and a vegetable. Please write either HM or CN on your menus. Tomato sauce, pizza sauce, spaghetti sauce on the pizza must have an additional vegetable or fruit on the pizza to be creditable. You must also serve an additional fruit or vegetable and milk with the pizza to make a complete, creditable meal. A pizza crust such as Boboli or a commercial frozen pizza is creditable as long as it is enriched or whole grain as the first ingredient. You will need to do additional cheese/meat on commercial pizza (write extra cheese/meat). A complete meal will look like this: Pepperoni & Cheese, HM pizza crust, {pizza sauce & green peppers & onions}, apple, milk.

Prunes and dried apricots are in the dried fruit category. An additional fruit or vegetable must be served. All dried fruit fall into the same category as raisins. See your Creditable Food Guide for 2012 for more specific information on dried fruits. Deductions will be done beginning with May 2014 claims, if an additional fruit or vegetable has not been served and recorded on the menu.
