To guarantee on-time payment, your claim is due by the 5th of the month. Unfortunately, we are not able to extend this deadline when there is a holiday or weekend that limits mail delivery. If you struggle to get your claim in by the 5th, we recommend online claiming or priority mail as alternate options.

The last day we can receive original January Claims for processing is MARCH 25, 2019.

The last day we can receive original February claims for processing is APRIL 25, 2019.

2018 Tax Report is in KidKare

To find your 2018 Tax Report, log in to your KidKare account, then:

- 1. Select "Report" option
- 2. Choose "Claim Statements"
- 3. Click on "Tax Report"

This will generate a pdf document that will appear as a small box at the bottom of your computer screen. By clicking on the small box, you can enlarge the document to view, print, or save it for your records.

Training for Helpers and Substitutes
